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INDIGENOUS SELF-GOVERNANCE CONTINUUM

INDIGENOUS RESPONSIBILITY & AUTHORITY

INDIGENOUS SELF-GOVERNANCE
 Indigenous people hold all responsibility & authority in fish, wildlife & land stewardship. Laws, regulations, management functions, decisions made by/for/with indigenous people & heard in indigenous forums.

INDIGENOUS MANAGEMENT
 Management by indigenous people with external legal framework.

CO-MANAGEMENT
 Sharing of the authority between indigenous people & government, which are mutually responsible.

INDIGENOUS COMMUNITARIANISM
 Indigenous people have a significant role in planning, agenda setting, and external decision-making.

INDIGENOUS CONTROL
 Indigenous people hold all responsibility & decision-making authority in fish, wildlife & land management, heard in governmental/judicial forums.

INDIGENOUS SOVEREIGNTY
 Indigenous people hold all responsibility & decision-making authority in fish, wildlife & land management, heard in governmental/judicial forums.
