DVM F711—Foundat ons of Veterinary Medicine IV	31928	Fourth semester of four-course series. Expanded physical examination of companion animals and livestock will be taught, with special emphasis on advanced techniques in reproduct on, surgical skills, anesthesia, and patient management.
DVM F733 — Principles of Surgery	31929	This course teaches principles and concepts of general and orthopedic surgery, including asept c technique, surgical instrumentat on, suture pat erns, t ssue healing, and wound management. Course runs from 1/25/25 - 3/21/25
DVM F737 — Principles of Veterinary Anesthesia	31930	This course is an introduct on to the principles of clinical anesthesia. Begin to get a feel for integrat ng your knowledge of basic sciences into making medical judgments in veterinary anesthesia.
DVM F742-Biology of Disease III Pathology of Organ Systems II	31931	The course will discuss principles of disease with emphasis on organ disease likely to be encountered in veterinary pract ce. The discussions will move from general cell-mediated processes to more specific disease mechanisms.
DVM F744 — Theriogenology	31932	Will familiarize students with reproduct ve organs of large and small animals: regulat on of funct on, reproduct ve endocrinology, reproduct ve cycles, and the physiology and pathology of reproduct on.
DVM F745 — Clinical Sciences I	31933	The course is an introduct on to clinical reasoning and problem solving as a diagnost cian. Diagnost c approaches to common medical problems of cardiovascular, urinary, and digest ve-hepat c systems. Course runs from 1/25/25 - 3/21/25
DVM F747 — Clinical Sciences II	31934	Cont nuat on of clinical reasoning and problemest ve
